

Sleigh-Full

Fill your sleigh with wrapped candy, use it to hold your Christmas cards or add greenery and miniature LED lights for a festive decoration.



Materials

FABRIC *Christmas prints are wonderful for this project.*

Main (Sides and Gusset):	One Fat Quarter or One quarter yard (9" x 42/44")
Binding and Runners:	One Fat Quarter or One quarter yard (9" x 42/44")

The sleigh can be made from two fat quarters or two quarter yards cut the full width of the fabric. Use one fabric for the sides and gusset and one fabric for the binding and runners. There will be little leftover and very little room for cutting errors.

Binding strips are cut across the width of the fabric giving just enough stretch to sew around the corners. If you are more comfortable with and choose to use bias binding, you will need two fat quarters of binding fabric (one for the bias binding and one for the runners). Bias binding directions not included.

STIFF DOUBLE-SIDED FUSIBLE INTERFACING $\frac{3}{4}$ yard
We recommend Peltex 72F by Pellon or Fast 2 Fuse

COORDINATED THREAD

*For machine sewing, use a 50 weight 2 ply thread
For hand sewing, use a 12 weight cotton thread*

OPTIONAL EMBELLISHMENTS

Two small buttons for the runners, grosgrain ribbon AND one or two jingle bells, Hot Fix crystals, decorative buttons, Christmas bulbs, or greenery AND micro LED lights (Moon Lights by Darice).

Other Tools: Sewing machine, Microtex 90/14 machine needles, very sharp scissors (both large and small), template plastic, Clover Wonder Clips, pins, hand sewing needles (we recommend milliner's needles size 7), rotary mat, acrylic rulers, rotary cutter, chalk or other marking tool, steam iron, parchment paper or Teflon ironing sheet.
