BAILEY ISLAND HOBO

Comfortable and easy just like an island vacation. Got lots of leftover batting? How about 2 ½" fabric strips? Here's a couple of practical and sweet hobo style bags to use them up!

Materials

FABRIC Hoffman CA Fabrics' Bali PopsTM are wonderful for this project. **BATTING** Use light to medium weight batting. Try Bosal's rolls of

Katahdin batting pre-cut 2½" x 25 yards (enough for 20 strips of fabric). If

using leftover batting, select leftovers that are similar in weight. Cut strips 2½"

wide.

Large BAILEY ISLAND HOBO

Bag Body 38 strips 2 ½" x 42/44"

Binding, Handles and Pockets 1¾ yards

Batting (bag body and handles) 42 strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 45" or

about 3 yards of 45" wide batting

Small BAILEY ISLAND HOBO

Bag Body 12 strips $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 42/44"

Binding, Handles and Pockets 3/4 yard

Batting (bag body and handles) 14 strips 2 ½" x 45"

about 1 yard of 45" wide batting

<u>BUTTONS</u> 2 Large (outside front/back); 2 Medium (outside sides) 4 Small (inside)

MATCHING COTTON THREAD- use a 50 weight 2 ply thread This project uses a lot of thread. Before beginning, pre-fill at least 2 bobbins. Also, you will need heavy cotton thread to gather the top of the bag (use perl cotton or upholstery thread).

MAGNETIC SNAP used pronged snaps or sew-in magnetic buttons

DREAM SEAM TAPE or any batting seam tape

Other Tools: Sewing Machine with a good zigzag stitch, machine needles- Microtex 90/14 and Jean's 110/18 and a Plexi-glass extension table. Hand sewing needles - try Milliner's needles size 5 and 9. Scissors (both large and small), rotary mat, acrylic rulers, 60mm rotary cutter, small foam core board or design wall, chalk.

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
