MATERIALS

FABRIC Large Medium Mini 1 yard Fat Quarter Sides & Bottom 1 yard For horizontal directional print fabric add 1/4 yard to Large for vertical (selvage to selvage) directional print fabric 1 yard is enough

Binding & Handles ³⁄₄ yard ³⁄₄ vard Fat Quarter Use leftover from either fabric above **Optional Closure**

DOUBLE-SIDED FUSIBLE BATTING Use Bosal's DUET FUSE II 1 yard for Large or Medium or a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12" rectangle for the Mini

STIFF DOUBLE-SIDED FUSIBLE INTERFACING Use Pellon's 72F ¹/₂ vard for Large or Medium or two 3" x 5" rectangles for the Mini

COTTON BATTING for Handles about 5" so Use your leftovers!!

SCREEN SPLINE for Handles 6 feet of .140 inch wide spline Soft plastic tubing used to repair window or door screens, available at hardware stores.

BUTTONS

Totes without a closure: 2 large $(1\frac{3}{4})$ and 2 medium 1 or 2 magnetic sew in snaps or buttons AND Totes with a closure: 4 medium (1") and 4 small (front cover) OR $2 \text{ large } (1^{3/4''}) \text{ and } 2 \text{ medium}$

MATCHING COTTON THREAD

Piecing thread to match side fabric and binding fabric. 12 weight cotton thread matching binding fabric for hand sewing.

Other Tools: Sewing Machine, sewing machine needles. Iron. Parchment paper or Teflon sheet. Removable marker or chalk. Scissors (both large and small), pins, Clover Wonder clips, 11" x 17" paper, rotary mat, 60mm rotary cutter, acrylic rulers, chalk, seam ripper, Milliner's size 7 hand sewing needles, measuring tape.
