

FUSE, FOLD & STITCH RUGS

Great area rug for bathroom, kitchen or beside the bed.

A double layer of foam batting provides a wonderful cushion under your feet! Quick zigzag stitched technique using wide strips. Made from fabric strips, or 10" squares like Layer Cakes or Shortcakes, or scout your stash for leftover 10" wide pieces

MATERIALS

FABRIC (select one of the 3 options)

Option 1: Use fabric strips: (rug size approximately 40" x 25")

| 3 yards | 1½ yards A | 1⅞ yards A |
| | 1⅝ yards B | 1⅞ yards B |

Note: Directional Fabric may require additional yardage

BINDING: ⅜ yard

Option 2: Use 10" squares (rug size approximately 38" x 25")

ONE LAYER CAKE consisting of forty 10" squares OR
TWO SHORTCAKES consisting of twenty 10" squares

BINDING & 4 Additional 10" SQUARES: ⅝ yard

Option 3: Use Scraps: (rug size approximately 40" x 25")

10" wide scraps totalling about 520" length

BINDING: ⅜ yard

INTERFACING

Bosal's In-R-Form Single-Sided Fusible Foam Batting (495S-25) on a roll
One 25 yard roll precut to 2¼" wide will make one rug

Other Tools:

Coordinated thread - we recommend Sew Fine by Superior Threads (a strong polyester thread). Sewing machine with a zigzag stitch and a walking foot. Janome's Purple Tip OR Viking's Inspira Denim 100/18 machine needles. Steam iron. Removable chalk or Frixion pen. Post It Notes or painter's tape. Scissors (both large and small), rotary cutting mat, acrylic rulers, 60mm rotary cutter, pins, seam ripper.
